

Qualifications for “Re-Interview”

Applicants cannot re-interview any sooner than one year from the original interview date. To qualify for a re-interview, the applicant must have either 1) completed two post-secondary, trade-related classes of at least one quarter in length, or 2) completed a minimum of 1,000 hours of electrical construction work with a C-10 electrical contractor.

Qualify

1. State registered apprentice
2. State registered electrical trainee
3. Nonunion electrician/apprentice
4. IBEW material handler classification
5. IBEW Sound & Communication (working for a C-10 contractor)
6. MC3 Certification

Do Not Qualify

1. Solar installation
2. Nonunion low voltage/telecommunications
3. Labor placement Agency “outsource”

Acceptable forms of proof of hours include:

1. W-2 Reports
2. Employers pay stubs (previous or current)
3. Social Security Hours Report
4. IBEW/NECA print of hours worked

According to the Executive Secretary for the National Electrical Training Alliance, solar installation is NOT considered as “electrical construction”.

Definition: **Post-secondary education** refers to **formal education that takes place after high school**, including vocational training, community college programs, and university degrees. It encompasses various programs, from associate degrees to advanced graduate and professional degrees.

Online courses taken, other than those from an institution mentioned above, do NOT qualify.

Examples of accepted courses: Algebra I and II, Geometry, Trigonometry, Physics, The Plan Grid Construction Course, Electrical Code, HVAC Controls or other **Nine-week** construction relevant courses.
